Working For Strathcona Park Lodge & Outdoor Education Centre

WHAT IS STRATHCONA?

Strathcona Park Lodge and Outdoor Education Centre (SPL) is the largest and longest running outdoor education centre in Canada. Established in 1959 by high school teaches, Myrna and Jim Boulding, the Lodge still maintains its “family-run” feel. Since then, more than 70 thousand students and guests from all over British Columbia and the world have visited SPL; the Lodge hosts over 5000 students annually. We are not your typical summer camp or resort. We operate both as an experiential outdoor education destination as well as a lodge accommodating guests, from local to international travelers. Our programs are designed to challenge participants physically, mentally and emotionally to take on new experiences, develop and grow while enhancing awareness of their environment.

STAFF

SPL is devoted to providing the highest quality of outdoor recreation and experiential learning. We require a competent, committed, and team-focused instructional staff whose passion is to provide others with positive learning experiences in a supportive, non-threatening and inclusive environment. We look for instructors who are interested in facilitating meaningful experiences that contribute to the growth of their students and guests. We also look for individuals who are motivated and committed to grow and develop as people and as professionals. All staff must work well in team situations, and be willing to work long hours. Outdoor education can be very demanding and requires enthusiasm and vision to ensure a positive experience for both the student and the teacher. Ultimately, our instructors are people with a balance of outdoor, technical, and interpersonal skills.

STRATHCONA STANDARDS

All applicants require experience in teaching and leading in an outdoor setting with strong group facilitation and risk management skills. We seek people who have solid technical skills with personal and/or institutional experience in canoeing, rock climbing, ropes courses, multi-day backcountry travel, and whitewater/ocean paddling.

EXPERIENCE AND QUALIFICATIONS

Spring and/or Fall Instructional Seasons: Requires applicants to have a strong background in teaching and leading in the outdoors and working with youth. During these parts of the season the emphasis is on school programs, students aged 9 to 17, with an average age of 14. The focus is student learning and growth and therefore demands a high level of interest and energy on the part of the instructor. An engaging personality is essential.

Summer Instructional Season: Experience guiding or in the area of adventure tourism is an asset. An engaging personality is essential.

PROGRAMS

SPL programs aim to provide students and guests with a comprehensive experience, helping them to heighten their awareness and appreciation for the outdoors while developing self-esteem, leadership and interpersonal skills.

Spring season (March – June)

The focus is on school programs, typically 5 days in length. Students range in age from 9-17 and come from all over British Columbia.

Adventure Program – This is our signature program that introduces students to a variety of lodge-based outdoor activities including canoeing, kayaking, rock climbing, ropes courses, survival skills, orienteering and environmental education. Most of these programs also incorporate a one night out-trip. The instructor to student ratio on these programs is 1:10 and each group is accompanied by one teacher/parent chaperone.

Specialty Program – This program allows students to focus on one skill. Courses include canoeing, whitewater and ocean paddling, backpacking, rock climbing, primitive skills and trail building. All of the programs are multi-day and have an instructor to student ratio of 2:10.

Summer season (July – August)

We deliver a variety of programs during the summer season that cater to a wide spectrum of clientele from families with young children, teenagers to seniors. This is our most varied season. Instructors generally function in the more polished role of a guide. Please check our web page, www.strathcona.bc.ca, for more details of each of the programs listed below.

Private Guide: Custom activities ranging from single day to week long trips. Instructors function in the more polished role of a guide.

Adventure Unlimited: Our feature summer product for people of all ages and sizes; expect anything from families with young children, couples or seniors. In this program, clients choose the activities they would like to participate in. Activities may include any of the Adventure Program activities, day hikes, waterfall tours, overnight camping or a day of whitewater on a locate river – they name it, we do it! Instructors function in the more polished role of a guide.

Alpine to Ocean Adventures: Custom trips for adults with an instructional focus, ranging from multi-day sea kayaking to backcountry mountain travel. Instructors function in the more polished role of a guide.

Family Adventure: Our classic Adventure Program geared toward families.

Intergenerational Adventures: Our classic Adventure Program geared toward seniors and their grandchildren; run in conjunction with Exploritas (formerly Elderhostel).

Wilderness Adventures: An adult only lodge based program with on site and off site day trips. It includes a dinner centered around the traditional smoking of local salmon. This program is run in conjunction with Exploritas (formerly Elderhostel).

WYLD Expeditions: (Wilderness Youth Leadership Development): Multi-day expedition-style courses for youth aged 12-17, focused on building students' self reliance, outdoor and interpersonal skills.

Fall season (September – October)

The focus turns back to school programs, with an emphasis on Specialty Programs.

Location: We are located 40 Km from Campbell River on Hwy 28. We are considered a remote location and this comes with both advantages and disadvantages. There is no public transportation to/from SPL. It can be difficult to get to/from town if you do not have your own vehicle, however people often offer rides and carpool.

Communication and Amenities: Due to our more remote location, we do not have standard phone land lines. Our communication systems operate via radio and/or satellite signals. Staff has access to a public radiotelephone, which is relatively expensive to use and also to a small computer room that has internet, thus making skype an option. It is recommended that staff bring their own laptops for their personal use. There is no cellular phone coverage in this area. We also have a small store on site that sells such basics as toothpaste, batteries, snacks, beer, wine and SPL clothing and souvenirs.

Compensation: – The pay scale at SPL is based on experience, certification and seniority. Wages range from \$87-\$106 per day. The exact per day rate is determined on the Instructor Wage Sheet prior to commencing work.

Accommodation: – Staff housing is allocated according to length of season and on individual seniority. Accommodation options include: tent platforms, dormitory style rooms, shared cabins and private rooms or cabins. Features such as plumbing, electricity, wood/propane heat vary amongst accommodations. Cost range from \$0 to \$90 bi-weekly, with the average bi-weekly cost being \$35. Any staff member wishing to supply their own accommodation (e.g. trailer) must have prior approval of the Executive Director and should make such requests known when applying. Dogs are permitted but accommodation options for staff with dogs are limited to those on our upper property; dog owners should make such requests known when applying.

Utilities: Staff is charged a fee of \$1 per day for the use of power, internet, water and laundry.

Food: Staff is charged a fee of \$10/day for food which includes 3 buffet meals per day, hot beverages and out-trip food for personal trips..

APPLICATION PROCESS

The hiring process begins in February and is usually done by mid-March, although we do accept applications on an ongoing basis. Once your application has been received it will be reviewed. If your application meets our criteria you will be contacted in order to arrange a telephone interview. Please include a current phone number and email address with your application so that we may be able to contact you.

Please submit your application no later than March 1st. If you have missed this deadline we do welcome and encourage applications on an ongoing basis as we sometimes have unexpected needs and therefore hire during the season. We offer positions for the full season (March to October) as well as a limited number for part seasons (spring, summer or fall).

If you are offered and accept a position, you must attend mandatory staff training and assessment. This training is unpaid, however food and accommodation is compensated for during this time period.
